i) Website

We will have a new website that will be deployed in time for the opening. We invite you to consult <http://www.tenniswoodland.com> to find out everything that is happening at the Club, including the conditions of the courts, especially in case of rain.

ii) New Employees

The Club will welcome new employees for the 2017 season, both for the maintenance and the reception. The most likely, while the circumstances permit it, is that the employees will have dedicated work shifts, that is, uniquely on the court for maintenance or at the reception in the chalet for the management of the reservation table and of the cafeteria.

iii) Registry of Guests

This year, we will have a registry of guests. When an employee is on duty, he or she will fill out the listing of guests and will do the collection of applicable fees. When an employee will not be on duty, the sign-up of the guest – before going on the court – must be done by the inviting member and the fees must be inserted in an envelope that will be slid underneath the kitchen door. If, for one reason or another, you do not have the necessary cash, simply advise us by placing a note inside the envelope and we will handle it at a later date.

iv) TSPA Day camp

The TSPA day camp returns to Tennis Woodland for a 7th straight year and will begin its 13th year of operation in the Greater Montreal region. TSPA will commence its activities on June 26. v) Court Allocation and Reservation Table

From the opening date and the beginning of the day camp to the end of June, maintenance will be done between 1pm and 5pm in the afternoon and as of 9pm for a progressive closing of the plateaus. We count on a collaboration of members while our employees must have access to two courts of the same plateau to do what is asked of them.

The allocation of the courts during the weeks of the day camp are as follows:

- Between 9am and 11am, there will be 4 TSPA courts and 2 courts for our members;
- Between 11am and 1pm, there will be 2 TSPA courts and 4 courts for our members;
- Between 1pm and 2pm, there will be 2 TSPA courts reserved for maintenance and 2 courts for our members;
- Between 2pm and 3pm, there will be 2 courts for the members and 4 courts reserved for maintenance;
- Between 3pm and 4pm, there will be 2 courts for maintenance, 2 courts for members and 2 courts for TSPA;
- As of 5pm, all of the courts are dedicated to the members, subject to Inter-Club activities and to social leagues approved by the club.

At all times, and regardless of scheduled activities, Tennis Woodland members can count on access to at least two courts for free practice. Please consult the calendar displayed inside the chalet to plan your activities knowingly. The club reserves the right to restrain access to the courts when maintenance is necessary.

Also, it is imperative to underline that members must always use the court reservation table to reserve their court, whether an employee is on duty or not. If an employee is not on the premises, the table will be placed outside of the cafeteria and the members can reserve any available court (or the next available court) for 60 minutes, whether it be to play singles or doubles. Please note that no reservation is permitted without being present at the club or being accepted by phone.

vi) Rules

The rules of the club are shown inside the chalet.

vii) Dedicated Maintenance Periods

Between 1pm and 5pm, there will be court maintenance on a daily basis. A maintenance schedule for our 6 courts will be shown on the bulletin board inside the chalet of the club.

The (1-2) (3-4) (5-6) plateaus will be scratched, swept and watered alternately during this period, and even rolled on occasion (especially after a rainfall).

It is possible that the maintenance hours will be modified if needed after a rainfall or during a period of great heat, or in any other circumstances that justify a maintenance.

The courts will also be the object of maintenance after game hours at the end of the night as well as before game hours on weekends.

viii) Inter-Club

We have a team that represents the Club in the Montreal Lakeshore Inter-Club League and it has won the championship during the last 3 seasons.

Except in case of rain-related exceptions, there will never be more than one barrage per week that will be held at the club. The home barrages of the A team will be held on Monday evenings as of 7pm. The schedule will be shown inside the chalet and on the Club's website.

ix) Access to Courts on Inter-Club and Social Leagues Nights

During Inter-Club nights, members will have all the same access to courts 1, 2, 3 and 4 up to 6pm on game nights. For Inter-Club nights, the four courts will once again become available at around 8:30pm, at the end of the games. Note that courts 5 and 6 are at the disposition of the members on a rotating basis at all times, on Inter-Club or social leagues nights.

For social leagues nights, members will have access to the courts until 7:15pm. The Wednesday night league usually takes four courts while the Thursday-Friday night league occupied on average two courts last year. Right now we are exploring the possibility of holding a competitive league on certain Tuesday nights, more details will follow.

x) Sunday Afternoon Intermediate to Advanced Intermediate Doubles League (4pm to 6pm)

For a fifth straight season, Mr. Firas Molhem is organising a Sunday doubles league that will play at the end of the afternoon, usually between 4pm and 6pm. Firas can be reached at tennis4fun@live.ca.

xi) Bougex Saturday Night League

The format remains to be determined but we will try the experience of a social league that will happen on Saturday nights. The launch is previewed for June 10. More details to come.

xii) Club Tournaments

For the members, there will obviously be end-of-season tournaments to crown the champions of the club in different categories. The tournaments will start in mid-August and end on the Sunday before Labour Day.

xiii) Alcohol Consumption at the Club

We have an alcohol permit and any alcoholic beverage found at the club must have been stamped.

Therefore, as previewed in our rules, we wish to remind you that it is strictly forbidden, at all times, to consume or even simply be in possession of alcoholic beverages that were not purchased at the club's restaurant. In case of breach, we expose ourselves to important fines and other sanctions imposed by the Régie des alcools, des courses et des jeux, ranging from the suspension to the removal of our alcohol permit.

xiv) Number of Permitted Visits Per Guest

We wish to remind you that the maximum number of visits per guest to play at the club per season is 3. 2016 members that have not renewed their registration before June 1, 2017 will therefore be considered as guests after this date and will need to pay the applicable guest fees, up until the occurrence of 3 permissible visits.

xv) Authorized Leagues

The only authorized leagues at the Club are those that we reference in this Info-Woodland. Members that come to play at the Club in groups must respect the functioning of the reservation table and the other rules in place at the Club, as shown inside.

xvii) Non-smoking environment

The Club is a non-smoking environment, both inside the chalet and on the terrace and on the courts.
